

Mystery readers are in good hands with this well-crafted, character- driven crime novel. –Kirkus Reviews




BOOK 4 - UPDATE - DEATH IN THE EMPIRE CITY

PLUM ISLAND is a gripping mystery thriller set on Long Island's picturesque North Fork. NYPD Detective John Corey is convalescing in the township of Southold, a region known for its fishing, farming,



antiques, vineyards, and rich New World history. His friends, Tom and Judy Gordon, are murdered in cold blood. Was it a burglary gone wrong or bioterrorism?




